

**Personal, Social and Emotional Development**



We are continuing to focus on following the routines in Nursery and making good choices. We will continue to develop our independence during choosing time and become more confident to ask staff or our friends for help when we need it. We will be focusing on playing with a partner or in a small group collaboratively, taking turns and using talk to negotiate and extend our play experiences positively.

**Communication and Language**



We will be continuing to enjoy lots of listening, speaking and memory games. We will be practising following instructions that are more complex. We will be learning to hear and recognise single sounds using the RWInc phonic programme picture cards, which will help us to orally blend and segment simple words. Children will be learning more rhymes and action songs, which they will perform together as a class. They will enjoy a range of key text stories including The Very Hungry Caterpillar, One Mole Digging a Hole and The Three Little Pigs.

**Physical Development**



Children will continue to use lots of different equipment (trikes, scooters, balls, beads, scissors and stencils) to help to build strength and control of large and small movements. We will be spending lots of time outside moving and playing on large equipment to develop our awareness of space and balance. We will continue to play racing games and to move around adults and other children safely. We will be practising for Sports day.

**Religious Education**



**Easter** - We will be learning that Jesus came back to life again and that this was a happy time.

**Pentecost** - We will be learning that the Holy Spirit is the third part of the Sign of the Cross and that red is the colour associated with this Season.

**Special Celebrations** - We will be learning that celebrations, especially marriages, are happy occasions, which may include prayers.

**Maths**



We will be continuing to count, recognise and order numbers 1-10 in different situations and will be starting to count backwards. We will be developing an interest in number problems and adding sets together. We will be learning to talk about shape, size and position.

**Literacy**



We will be making many marks, including writing our names, using a range of tools and be able to tell an adult what these mean. We will be continuing to enjoy a wide range of stories, songs and rhymes and try to recall them with accurate detail and expression.

**Understanding of the World**



We will be observing all of the seasonal changes that are happening in the environment around us and developing our understanding of how things change and grow. We will enjoy learning about the celebration of Father's Day and observing caterpillars becoming butterflies. We will enjoy a visit to a farm.

**Expressive Arts and Design**



We will explore a range of different art and craft materials to represent our learning. We will continue to develop our imaginative play using various role-play resources.
