

Religious Education



Easter . In this unit the children study the story of Easter from the perspective of Thomas. The work contained in this unit will require them to think about reasons why Thomas did not believe in the Resurrection of Christ at first and why people today believe that Jesus is risen from the dead. Children will also learn about Easter and the promise of eternal life. They will be introduced to some associations with Baptism and the celebration of a Christian funeral.

Pentecost In this unit the children will learn about two stories from the New Testament about the coming of the Holy Spirit. Through their study of the Sacrament of Confirmation they will learn about the Gifts and Fruits of the Holy Spirit and how they are important in the lives of Christians.

Belonging to the Church

Community In this unit of work the children will learn about the foundations of the life and teaching of the Catholic Church being rooted in the life and teaching of the Apostles. The children will learn about the role of the Pope and local Bishop in the life of the universal and local Church. They will also explore the life of the local parish community where the faith of God's People is nourished and celebrated.

Celebrating the Life of Mary & the

saints In this unit we explore some of the Church's beliefs about Mary and the feasts that are celebrated in her honour. The children will consider why her role in the life of Christ was so important.

Science



Variations and Adaptions

In this unit the children will learn to identify how animals and plants adapt to their environments in different ways and that adaption may lead to evolution. They will explore this through Charles Darwin's enquiry question, "Is there a type of food a bird eats related to the shape of its beak?" They will investigate this line of enquiry and show their findings through both oral and written work.

Made In Coventry

In this unit, children will learn about the past and present industries that formed most of the jobs for the working population in Coventry: Car & bicycle industry, Textiles, and Watchmaking. They will identify continuity and change in the history of the locality of our school area. Describe the main changes in a period of history focusing on the social, political, technological and cultural impact. Identify and link together periods of rapid change in history and contrast them with times of relatively little change in Coventry. Display an understanding of the concepts of continuity and change over time, representing them, along with evidence, on a time line. They will undertake a walk of the local area to include the Transport Museum, the Watchmaker's and Cash's textiles area.
