At St Osburg's we believe that Art and Design should enable children to build upon their early creative experience to express themselves in a practical and inspiring way.



Intent- We aim to

Develop a curriculum where art and design are embedded across many subject areas.



Engage, inspire and challenge pupils to experiment, invent and create their own works of art.



Create artists who have built respect, natural inquisitiveness and an appreciation of art through learning about art from other cultures and periods of history.



Ensure that children experience a range of visual, tactile and sensory experiences which allow them to communicate what they can see, think and feel.



Produce children are able to think critically and develop a more rigorous understanding of art and design.



Implementation

At St Osburg's our art and design curriculum is a skills based curriculum designed to equip children with the knowledge and skills to experiment, invent and create their own works of art. Our whole school curriculum provides children with opportunities to develop their skills using a variety of medium and materials. Specific skills are built upon each key stage and tracked through our progression of skills document. All children have the opportunity to explore and evaluate different creative ideas and develop their skills in key areas. We introduce children to a wide range of artists, including old masters and contemporary artists.

What this looks like at St Osburg's

- At St Osburg's we have designed a bespoke art and design curriculum following the guidance set out in the NC and have tailored this to our children.
- In EYFS, children build the foundations of the art and design curriculum through creating with materials and being imaginative and expressive. Through topic based work in their continuous provision, they safely use and explore a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function.
- Through KS1 and KS2 the children develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space.
- We value diversity studying a range of artists who are of different race, gender and religion and use them as inspiration for their own pieces of artwork.



Impact

Our children are clear about what the intended outcomes are and can reflect and evaluate their own and other's work, thinking about how they can make changes and improvements. Our children get to experiment, investigate and most importantly have fun with their creativity. They display a deep understanding of art and design which is showcased in their sketch books and on Tapestry. Our children feel like artists.
