Our Pilgrimage

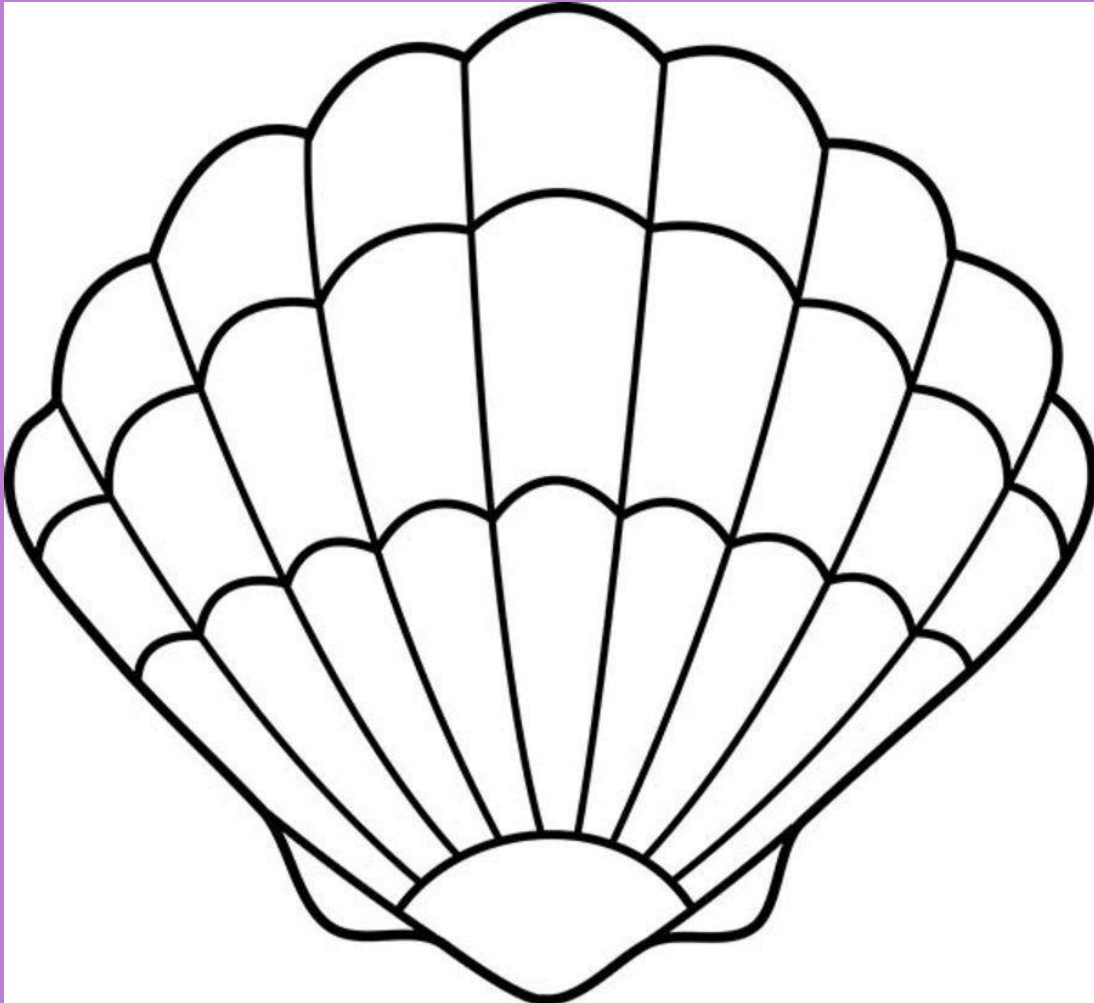
We hear of so many people taking part in a journey throughout the Gospel.

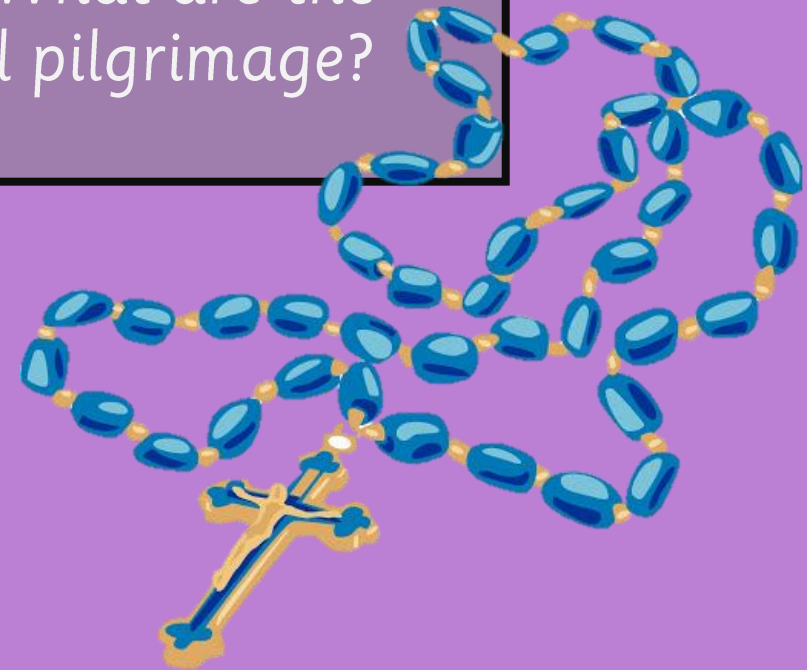

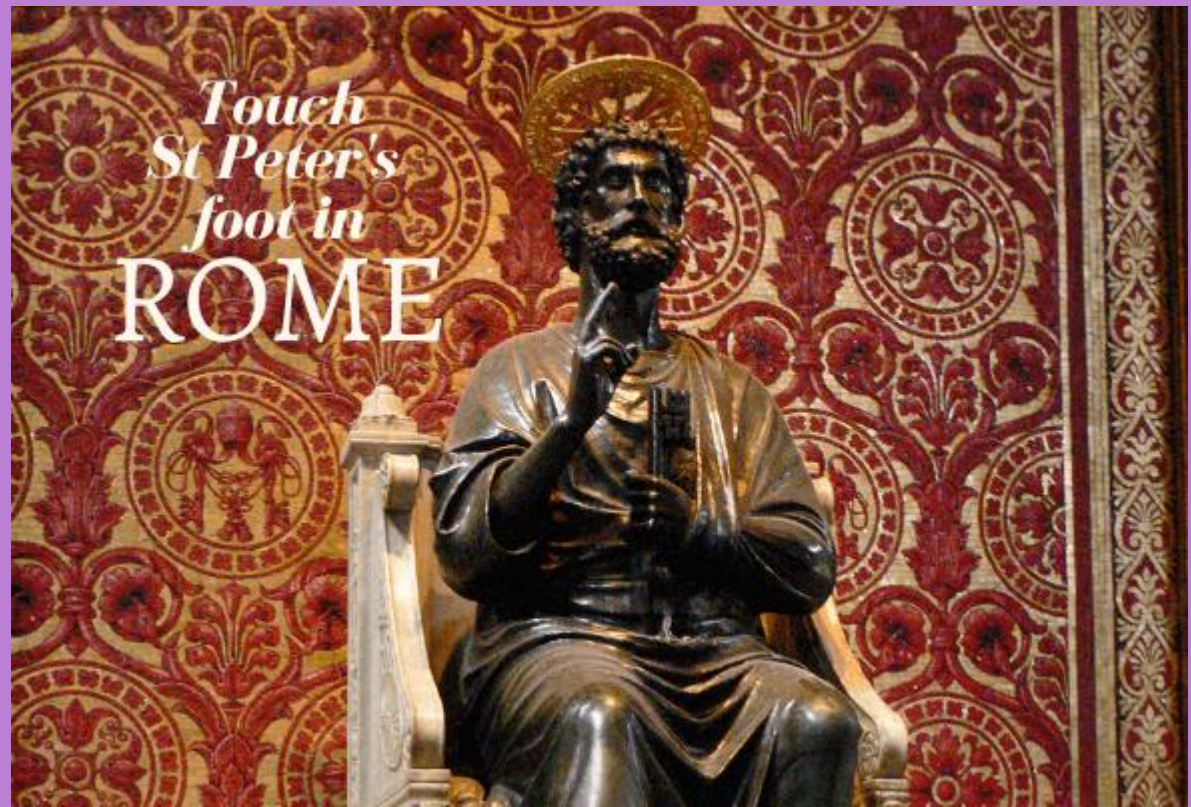

St Peter's Basilica

Some facts about St Peter's Basilica



- St Peter's is 452 feet high, 730 feet in length, and 500 feet in width, with an interior length of just over 693 feet (roughly 211 metres).
- St. Peter's Basilica is home to over 100 tombs, 91 of which belongs to popes, and the Holy Roman Emperor Otto II and Swedish Queen Christina; 2 royalties who gave up the throne for Catholicism.
- On the outside top colonnade of St. Peter's Basilica are over 140 statues of various saints.
- St. Peter's Basilica has a capacity of 60,000 people.
- Michelangelo, the architect responsible for designing the main dome of the Basilica, was also a sculptor and a painter, who became one the greatest artists of his time.
