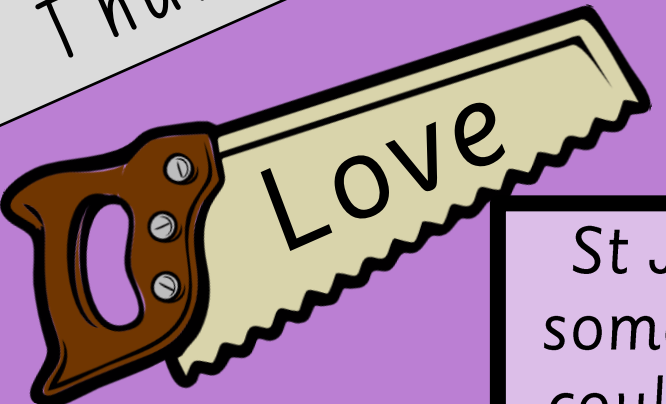
St. Joseph

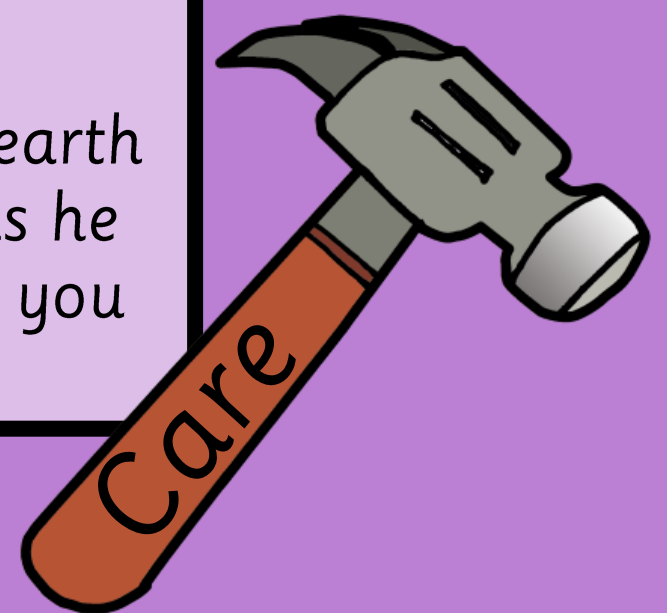
