Things to remember:

- recent events (yesterday, last weekend, last week);
- interesting story;
- use formal language throughout your report;
- use columns and paragraphs to organise your text;
- use FACTS
- use past tense and third person
- short introductory paragraph (5 'W's')
- Pictures with captions

Examples of mistakes:

2. Early this morning, the Prime Minister announced a new law that grants every child in the country free ice- cream. Mr Johnson also called his distant cousin and asked about the weather in Canada. He ate a butter croissant and went to the park.
