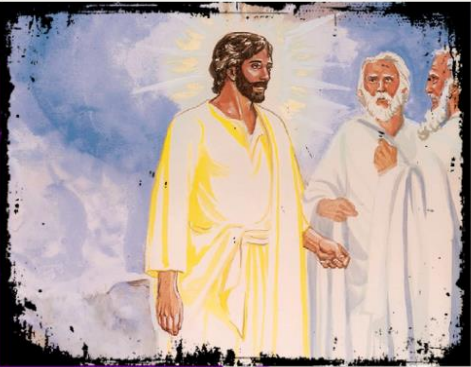

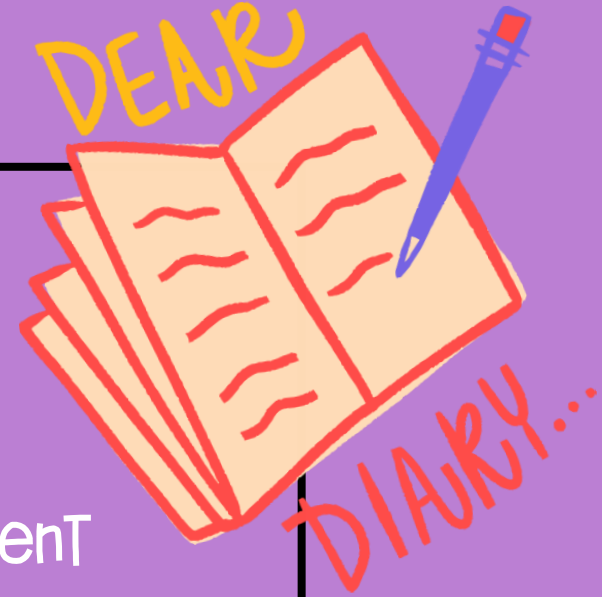

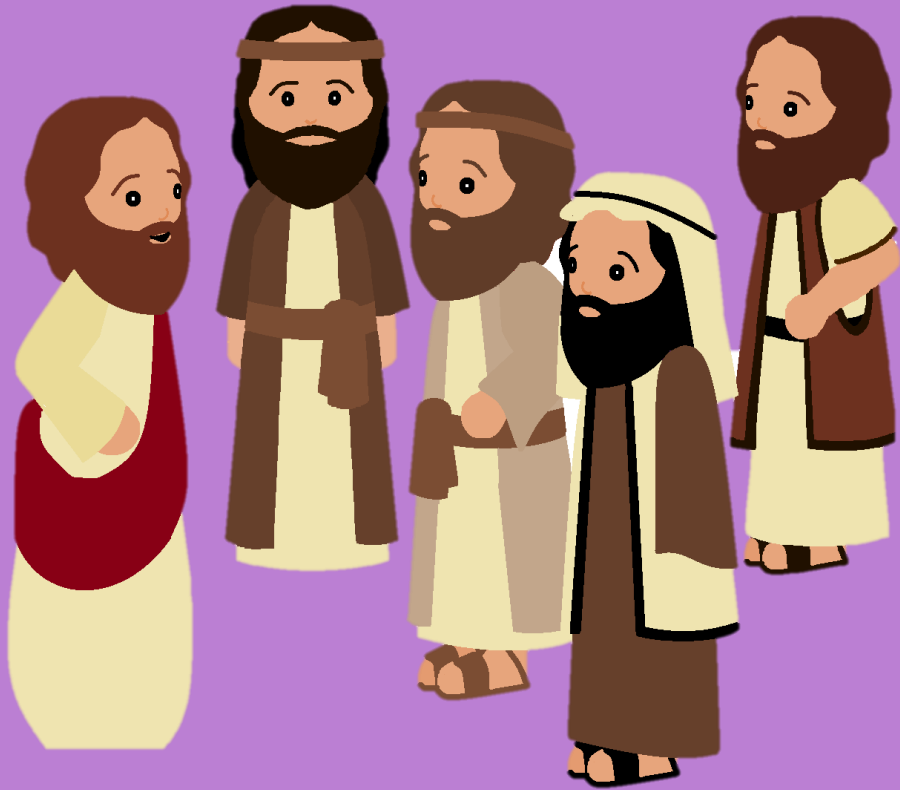

The Good Samaritan



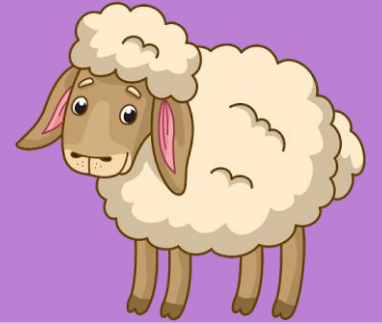
The man in the story helped another person in need. One of the pillars of Lent is almsgiving, meaning to help other people who need support.

If you can, donate one tin of food to a foodbank. This may can help someone who is struggling at this time.

If you are unable, say a prayer for a person in need.

The Lost Sheep



One day the shepherd counted his sheep and found that there were only 99 sheep instead of 100. The shepherd was so worried. One of the sheep must be lost.

Even though 99 of the sheep were safe the shepherd was so concerned about the 1 sheep that was lost. Immediately, he left the other sheep in a safe place and set off looking for the lost sheep.

The shepherd searched everywhere. What if the sheep was hurt? What if some wild animals had attacked it?

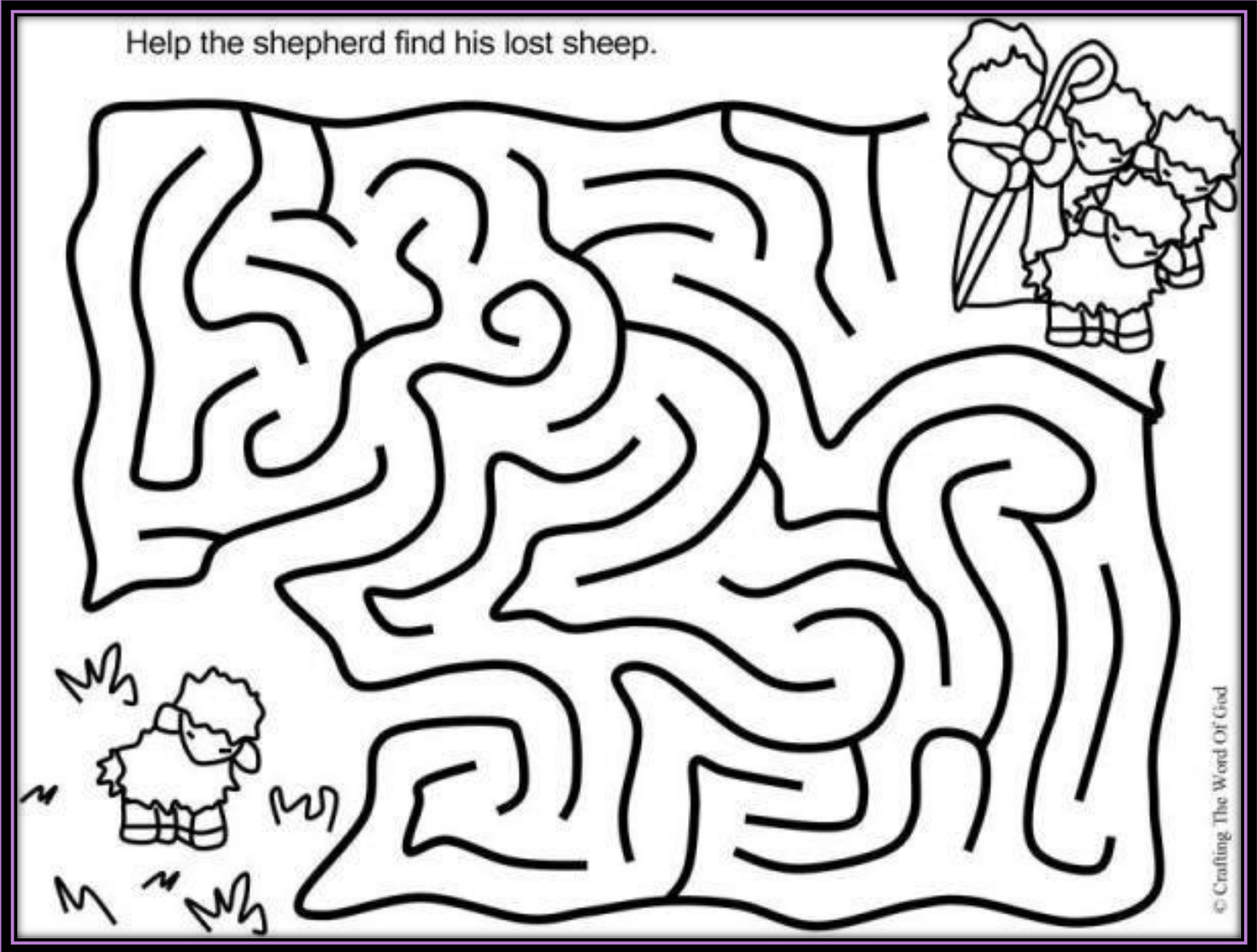
Finally, he found the lost sheep! The shepherd was so relieved and happy.

The shepherd lifted the sheep up onto his shoulders and carried him all the way back to join the rest of the flock.

The parable that Jesus told helped the people understand. Every sheep is important to the shepherd. Even if only one is lost he will search everywhere to find it.

The Mustard Seed



Our Faith is like the Mustard Seed.

Water – The more we feed it by praying and going to Mass the more it will grow.

Heat – If we love and look after our faith seed it will always grow and we will feel a greater connection with Jesus.

Light – Jesus is the light of the world. Without him our faith will never grow.

The Mustard Seed

Watch the mustard seed grow. If you feed it enough it will grow over time.

Half a potato and scoop out the top part. Place in a damp piece of cotton wool. Sprinkle your mustard seeds on top.

Check the regularly to see if the cotton wool is damp. If it isn't add a spot of water.
