# New Skill - Fronted Adverbials

A **adverbial** is a word or phrase that has been used like an adverb. They tell you **how**, **where** or **when** something has happened.

It is called a **fronted adverbial** because it goes at the front of the sentence and it always has a comma after it.

## How (manner) fronted adverbial

**Happily**, they played with their toys.

## When (time) fronted adverbial

**Yesterday**, we went to the park.

## Where (place) fronted adverbial

**By the fire**, they drank their hot chocolate.
