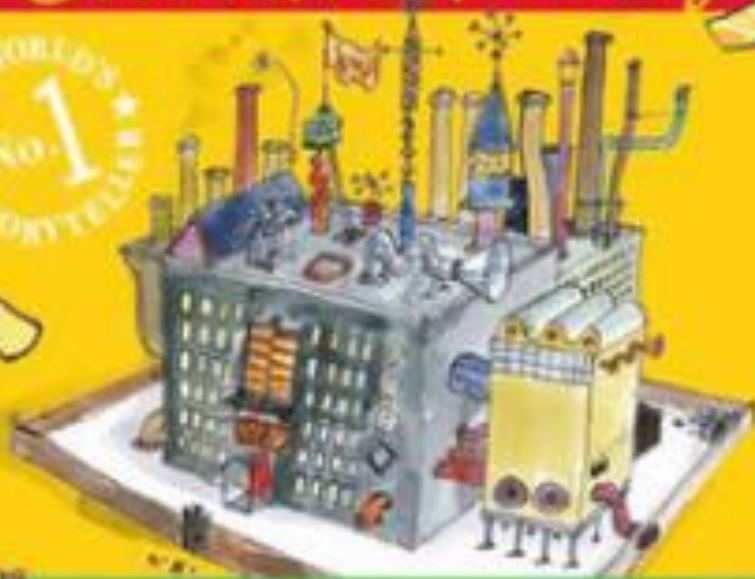

Task:
