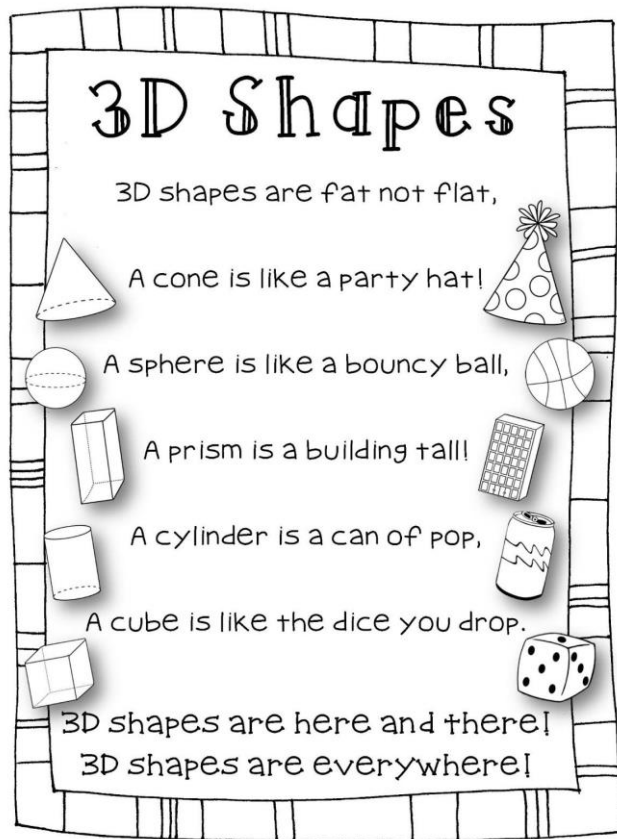



Helpful tip: Talk about who an emperor is and what a tailor does. Talk about what the expression means ‘in thin air’.

Theme Lessons – Valentine's Day

Make a fizzing Love Potion – Science Experiment

You will need:

Bicarbonate of Soda

Vinegar

Washing up liquid

Pink/Red food colouring

Glitter (optional)

A small glass or clean jar/bowl/shot glass/ice cube tray

A spoon

A tray or large dish which can contain the overflow

Instructions

First, fill your chosen small container half way with vinegar, then stir in a spoonful of your chosen colour.

Next add a big squeeze of washing up liquid and a helping of glitter

Then add in a spoonful of bicarbonate of soda (baking soda) and start to stir with the spoon

The potion will bubble and froth, fizzing out over the jar and making a gorgeous, sparkly mixture!
