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Safeguarding Children – our annual statement

In the interest of safeguarding children there may be occasions when the school has to consult other agencies without a parent's prior knowledge. The school's first concern is the child's welfare, and the school has a duty to act to protect the child at all times. Such consultation may result in a formal referral which could prompt visits from social services and/or the police. We fully understand that this can be a very distressing set of circumstances, but we can only assure you that we follow the procedures laid down by the Coventry Safeguarding Board, a copy of which is available in school as is a copy of our own policy.

Year 4 SPARKS Workshop On Thursday, Year 4 were visited by firefighters from West Midlands Fire Service who delivered a 'SPARKS' workshop to the class. They watched some videos and heard about real-life situations as they learnt lots about fire facts, dangers and hazards in addition to learning about prevention, emergency calls, smoke detectors and escape plans. The children were also given lots of advice on road and in-car safety. Having spoken to Year 4 today about what they could remember I was very impressed with how well they must have listened as they could remember a great deal and gave me lots of good advice! ☺



Sight Tests – When was the last time that you had your child's eyes tested? It is recommended that this is done every two years in order to pick up any potential issues. Some children are reporting that they have never been for an eye test. Failure to address eye health issues early on can lead to difficulties developing key abilities such as spatial awareness, motor skills, sensory development, communication, social skills and of course everyday learning. Please do try to book these in regularly.
